Issued 25 May 2011

125 years ago, the Imperial Patent Office in Berlin granted patent no. 37435 to a "vehicle with gas-engine drive". This is recognised today as the 'birth certificate' of the automobile. The certificate was inscribed "Patented in the German Reich, 29 January 1886. The stamp depicts the world's first automobile together with a drawing taken from the patent document dated 29 January 1886.
